

TREND: State Legislators are Largely Rejecting State Preemption Bills that Prohibit Local Governments from Adopting Pit Bull Laws

13 Year Trend: January 2012 to December 31, 2024

In 2012, a new wave of state preemption bills barring cities and counties from enacting breed-specific laws began being pushed by Utah-based fighting dog advocates, Best Friends Animal Society, and dog breeder interest groups.

Since January 2012, state legislators have rejected 85% (58) of these preemption bills.

Over the last 5 years, Jan. 2020 to Dec. 2024, the rejection rate increased to 96%.
